Pre-Procedure Instructions





BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE:

- A Pre-Assessment Nurse will call you to:
 - Review your medical and surgical history.
 - Review your current medications.
 - Provide you instructions to follow prior to your procedure date.
 - Please have your current medication list and be prepared to take notes on instructions given to you.
- Arrange for transportation to and from your procedure. You are required to be discharged home with a responsible adult who can receive discharge instructions to assist you in your recovery at home.
 - **NOTE:** Uber/ Lyft and MARTA are **NOT** acceptable forms of transportation at discharge unless you are accompanied by a responsible adult.

NIGHT BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE:

FOR YOUR SAFETY, FAILURE TO FOLLOW DIET AND PREP INSTRUCTIONS MAY RESULT IN YOUR PROCEDURE BEING DELAYED OR CANCELED.

- DO NOT eat or drink anything after midnight
 - The **day of your procedure**, you may need to complete your bowel prep as directed by your physician and should take **approved** medications with a small sip of water (see attached list for medications and how to hold them).
- Follow the prep instructions provided by your doctor. If you have any questions about your prep, contact your doctor's office.
 - Note: Clear liquids include: water, tea, coffee, broth, Gatorade, apple juice or grape juice (no citrus juices). Sugar is acceptable. No milk products or creamer, no purple or red colored liquids.

GLP-1 receptor agonist medications slow your stomach from emptying. For your safety, it is recommended that you follow a **clear liquid diet 24 hours before your procedure** to allow your stomach to completely empty.

Medication Instructions (continued)

When to stop taking your medications before procedure:

- Your procedure date is day 0.
- You will count backwards from your procedure date for the number of days you must stop taking your medication.
